Day 1 - Friday, 26th February 2027 - Arrive Rio de Janeiro:

You will be met on arrival at the airport and transferred to your hotel. Rio de Janeiro is without doubt South America's most beautiful city and regarded as the holiday capital of Brazil. From the white sand beaches to the winding streets of the favelas up to Corcovado and Christ the Redeemer towering over Rio's six million local inhabitants (known as cariocas), this short break will introduce you to the city.



There will be a welcome meeting with your Tour Leader in the hotel lobby (time to be confirmed). Tonight, head out and enjoy a Welcome Dinner with an authentic Brazilian BBQ dinner, where the vibrant flavours of churrasco come to life. Savor a variety of perfectly grilled meats, from succulent beef and pork to tender chicken, all expertly seasoned and cooked to perfection. 




Day 2 - Saturday 27 February 2027 - Rio de Janeiro:

Today you'll get to know the sights and sounds of Rio during a tour with your guide. Visit Corcovado Mountain for expansive views over the city from the base of the Christ the Redeemer statue. Enjoy a panoramic tour of Rio de Janeiro's beaches; Copacabana, Ipanema and Leblon.

Afterwards, visit the iconic Sugarloaf Mountain and enjoy its stunning views. Its name comes from the mountain's resemblance to a traditional sugarloaf – a tall cone of refined sugar that was popular in the Caribbean and Brazil until the late 19th century. In the afternoon enjoy some time to relax, hit the beach, or explore further. End your day with a lively dinner and an entertaining show at Roxy Dinner Show - a unique experience combining a Brazilian dinner with a theatrical performance showcasing Brazilian culture, featuring live music, dance, and artistic expressions, celebrating the country's diverse traditions and rhythms,



including samba, funk, and MPB. The venue is a beautifully restored art deco Roxy Theater, enhancing the sophisticated atmosphere.

Day 3 - Sunday 28 February 2027 - Fly to Puerto Iguazu:

This morning, bid farewell to Rio as you get transferred to the Rio de Janeiro airport and board your flight to Foz de Iguazu. Powerful, captivating and completely beautiful – coming face to face with the Iguazu Falls is sure to leave you awe-struck. You will spend the next two days exploring the falls in depth, seeing them from both the Argentinian and Brazilian side. Today will be spent exploring the Brazilian side of Iguazu Falls. At over two kilometres in length, and made up of 275 waterfalls in total, Iguazu is higher than Niagara Falls and wider than Victoria Falls.



The Brazilian side of the falls offers unforgettable panoramic views, which you'll get to spend time taking in today.

<u>Day 4 - Monday, 1st March 2027 - Puerto</u> <u>Iguazu:</u>

Today you'll explore Iguazu Falls from the Argentinian side. Beginning at the visitors' centre, you'll take a ride on the Rainforest Ecological Train before exploring the upper and lower circuit footbridges. These



footbridges, raised off the jungle floor, provide panoramic views from above and below the falls. A visit to monumental, roaring Devil's Throat – arguably the most spectacular of the falls – is one of the day's highlights. It's the heart of the falls and the highest, at about 80 metres. The noise as these mighty falls plunge to the bottom of the narrow canyon is almost

deafening - no visit to Iguazu is complete without viewing the Devil's Throat Falls.

From there, take a stroll through the Buenos Aires Ecological Reserve, a tranquil green space that offers scenic views of the Rio de la Plata and a peaceful escape from the city's hustle. Next, travel in a private vehicle to the charming northern suburbs of Buenos Aires, stopping first in San Isidro. Wander its cobbled streets, admire the neo-Gothic cathedral, and explore its leafy plazas filled with historic mansions. Continue to the picturesque town of Tigre, located in the Paraná Delta and often referred to as "South America's Venice." Discover its highlights on a walking tour, including the famous Fruit Market, vibrant waterfront promenades like Paseo Victorica, and the elegant Tigre Art Museum housed in a beautiful Belle Époque building. Board a private boat to explore the lush maze of islands that make up the world's third-largest river delta. Enjoy a homemade, traditional lunch on one of the islands, with time to relax, swim, or optionally kayak through the serene waterways. On the way back, pass through elegant residential areas and learn about the unique lifestyle of the isleños—residents of the delta who have built a rich culture adapted to island life. You'll also see historical landmarks like the house of former Argentine president Domingo Sarmiento, who championed the development of this area. Tonight, experience an unforgettable evening in Buenos Aires with a Tango Show and Dinner at the elegant Palacio Tango Piazzolla. Enjoy gourmet Argentine cuisine in a stunning historic

setting, followed by a captivating tango performance showcasing world-class dancers and live music.

This immersive countryside experience will transport you back in time, offering a rich blend of folklore, customs, and skilled demonstrations. See the historic town, full of charming old houses and monuments that tell the story of Argentina's rural heritage. The estancia is considered



one of the most authentic and attractive in the country, known for its deep-rooted Creole character. The day begins with a warm welcome featuring cheeses, traditional empanadas, Argentine wines, and an authentic asado (barbecue), all accompanied by local pastries and a live guitar performance. You'll enjoy demonstrations of traditional practices and attire, horseback riding, carriage rides, rural sports, and cultural workshops. An unforgettable day immersed in Argentina's countryside and traditions. After a full day out, head back to your hotel ready to embark on your Antarctic journey!

Flying south to Ushuaia where you'll board your ship Your adventure begins with an early morning flight to Ushuaia, where you'll meet your hybrid-powered expedition ship, specially designed for sustainable cruising in polar waters. This bustling port is the capital of Argentina's Tierra del Fuego Province. Set against the magnificent backdrop of the Martial Glacier, Ushuaia vies for the title of the world's southernmost city.



After a briefing from your Expedition Team, you'll have time to settle into your cabin and explore the comforts and amenities on board.

You'll learn how to make your visit as safe and as low impact as possible, and about the Citizen Science projects you can join.

Day 11-18 - Monday 8th March 2027 - Tuesday 16th March 2027 - Welcome to Antarctica:

Where most journeys to Antarctica end, yours only intensifies, offering unprecedented access to some lesser-explored areas.

Remember, this is an expedition voyage! This means we'll be able to adapt our itinerary depending on the sea and ice conditions, and we'll endeavour to spend at least one day – or possibly several – in

each of the following regions:

South Shetland Islands: Typically, the first glimpse of Antarctica for travellers, the South Shetland Islands boast a dramatic landscape across the 20-island archipelago. These rugged isles are not just strikingly beautiful, they are also teeming with wildlife, offering a vibrant, up-close encounter with nature's resilience and diversity. Antarctic Sound: A lesser-visited gem in the region, Antarctic Sound serves as a grand gateway to the Weddell Sea and is home to some of the largest tabular icebergs. This striking corridor of ice and water is also a prime habitat for observing the rarer Adélie Penguin and offers a unique snapshot of the grandeur of Antarctica.

The Weddell Sea: Navigable only by the most advanced ice-strengthened ships, the Weddell Sea offers a profound connection to Antarctic exploration history. It

was in this region in 1925 that Ernest Shackleton's ship, Endurance, was crushed by sea ice, setting off his legendary survival journey. Visitors to this harshly beautiful environment gain a vivid sense of Shackleton's extraordinary feats. Here, you might also see Emperor Penguins migrating to or from the nearby colony at Snow Hill Island.

Gerlache Strait: A centrepiece of Antarctic exploration, the Gerlache Strait, offers sheltered waterways ideal for up-close encounters with some of the continent's most iconic sights. This is the area where our ship's namesake, Roald Amundsen, in 1898 sailed aboard the Belgica before he and

the crew became the first humans to overwinter in Antarctica. Frequented by humpback whales and other cetaceans, this area mesmerises visitors with 360-degree views of snow-covered alpine landscapes, providing a truly awe-inspiring backdrop for adventure.

The Penola Strait (South of the Lemaire Channel): The Penola Strait, accessed via the French Channel offers a spectacular maze of penguin-covered islands set against the massive glacier-clad peaks of the continental shoreline.





This remote area, often beyond the range of standard voyages, teems with wildlife and presents boundless exploration opportunities. The abundant sea ice not only enhances the beauty but also increases the chance of observing seals and other wildlife.

If ice and sea conditions allow, the Expedition Team may choose the breathtaking Lemaire Channel instead of the Penola Strait. The former is often hailed as the world's most picturesque channel, for good reason.

Back on board, the Expedition Team will continue their lectures, enlightening and entertaining with their insights into the wonders of the frozen continent.

Ship Features:

MS Roald Amundsen is the first of two hybrid ships HX Hurtigruten Expeditions have added to their fleet. Emissions are cut by sailing with electrical propulsion. Innovative sustainable technology reduces the ship's fuel consumption and CO2 emissions by 20 percent. The stunning scenery is reflected in a rich and comfortable interior design. Scandinavian materials from nature, such as granite, oak, birch and wool are used to create relaxed and stylish cabins and public areas. All cabins are outside cabins, of which 50% have private balconies, and aft suites feature private outdoor hot tubs with spectacular views.

One of the most eye-catching exterior design features is the two-level indoor/outdoor Observation Deck. It is an ideal place to scan the scenery and watch for wildlife with your binoculars. Your all-inclusive includes...


