

# <u>South America Adventure Itinerary</u> 25 Days from 30<sup>th</sup> September – 24<sup>th</sup> October 2027

Day 1: Thursday 30th September 2027 – Arrival in Santiago De Chile: On arrival at Santiago Airport, please make your way through Customs and Immigration. There are now two exiting gates, one for taxis and one for pre-booked transfers. All travellers who have prebooked and prepaid for an arrival transfer, must exit through gate 4, which is for pre-booked transfers. Our representative will be holding a sign with your name on it and waiting for you outside this exit. Please only make contact with our representative and if you can't locate them, you can use the emergency contact details to call themor use WhatsApp to contact them. We ask that you contact our emergency contact number directly and don't let anyone else do this, as it's a common scam in Santiago Airport. Your transfer includes an English-speaking guide. Santiago, Chile's capital and largest city, lies



in a valley surrounded by the snow-capped mountains of the Andes and the Chilean Coastal Range. Founded in 1541, Santiago has been Chile's capital since colonial times. It is a vibrant and cosmopolitan city and although it features many colonial buildings, it has grown into a modern metropolis and the cultural centre of the country. Meals: Breakfast

Day 2: Friday 1st October 2027 – Arrival in Atacama: You will be collected from your hotel at the appropriate time and transferred to the airport for your onward flight. This service includes a Spanish speaking driver only. On arrival, please make your way through to the Arrivals Hall where our representative will be waiting for you to transfer you to your hotel. He/she will be holding a sign with your name on it. Please note this service is a shared service with driver only. The small oasis town of San Pedro de Atacama lies on an arid high plateau in the Andes Mountains in the heart of some of northern Chile's most spectacular scenery. Overlooking the Licancabur Volcano, its dramatic surrounding landscape ranges from desert, salt ats, steaming geysers and hot springs to fascinating rock formations. The church, dating back to 1774 and featuring



adobe, cactus wood and leather-bound beams and the Archaeological Museum are both worth a visit. Meals: Breakfast

Day 3: Saturday 2<sup>nd</sup> October 2027- Quitor & Tulor Half Day Archaeological Tour:

This morning, you will be picked up from your hotel to embark on a tour of San Pedro de Atacama, hailed as the archaeological capital of Chile. This small oasis town holds a significant cultural presence in Atacama, situated near the mouth of the primary river that nourishes the salt at. Nestled on an arid high plateau in the Andes Mountains, San Pedro de Atacama is surrounded by some of northern Chile's most breathtaking scenery. Our exploration begins at Pukará de Quitor, a historical site where the Atacama people organized themselves to resist the European invasion. Despite facing defeats, their resilience endured for over 20 years. Following this, we'll delve into Tulor Village, a discovery made in 1958



by the Jesuit priest Gustavo Le Paige. This village serves as a captivating representation of the traditional

Atacameños culture and way of life.

Day 4: Sunday 3<sup>rd</sup> October 2027 – Half day Atacama Salt Lake and Toconao Tour:

This afternoon, you will be picked up from your hotel to explore the Salar de Atacama, one of the world's largest salt lakes and home to the most important lithium reserves globally. At Chaxa Lagoon, delight in watching various bird species, including the three types of flamingos found in Chile - Andean, Chilean, and James'. The vibrant pink hues of their feathers contrast beautifully with the deep blue Atacama sky, the towering Andean volcanoes, and the red hues of the sunset bidding us farewell before returning to San Pedro de Atacama. On the way to the Salt Lake, we make a stop in the town of Toconao. The houses in this charming village are constructed from bricks of white volcanic stone, and its warm-hearted residents are renowned for their exceptional wool knitting skills. Once the tour concludes, you will be taken back to your hotel.

Day 5: Monday 4<sup>th</sup> October 2027 – Full day Tatio Geysers Tour: In the early morning, you'll be collected from your hotel for a full-day tour to the Tatio Geysers. Situated 90 km northwest of San Pedro, these geysers are nestled at an altitude of 4,320 meters above sea level, earning the distinction of being the highest geothermal eld globally. Witness the serene sunrise over the geysers as they erupt with water and steam, reaching heights of up to 50 meters. Surrounded by the tranquil beauty of the Andes and its natural scenery, you'll have a peaceful and reflective experience. On the return journey to your



hotel, you'll pass through the Wetlands, where you can quietly observe guanacos, vicuñas, flamingos, and other wildlife, adding a serene conclusion to your day of exploration.

#### Day 6: Tuesday 5<sup>th</sup> October 2025 – Arrival in Lima:

Lima, the capital of Peru, sits on the country's arid Pacific coast. Founded in 1535, its colonial centre is well preserved, but today Lima is a bustling metropolis and one of South America's largest cities. The city is home to the various museums including the Museo Larco that houses a collection of pre-Columbian art and the Museo de la Nación, tracing the history of Peru's ancient civilizations. Lima is known as the "gastronomical capital of the Americas", encompassing specialties from ceviche and traditional coastal cooking to refined global fare. It even boasts several of the top restaurants in the world. If you have any free days during your stay, we recommend that you take a visit to the Larcomar shopping centre. Located on a cliff with spectacular views of the Paci c Ocean in the heart of Lima's Mira ores district, it is worth the visit. You can either walk from Barranco or have your hotel arrange a taxi for you.

Day 7: Wednesday 6<sup>th</sup> October 2027 – Lima Taste of tradition & History – Half Day:

Start your journey with a convenient pick-up from your hotel, ready to explore Lima's culinary and historical treasures. The tour starts at a bustling local market, where you can sample a variety of exotic fruits unique to Peru. From there, take a short taxi ride to Lima's historic downtown for a scenic stroll from Plaza San Martin to Plaza de Armas. As you

walk, immerse yourself in the stunning colonial architecture and vibrant local atmosphere, stopping at the iconic El Cordano restaurant to enjoy a delicious traditional pork sandwich, a beloved local specialty. The adventure continues as you dive into Lima's past with a guided tour of the famous San Francisco catacombs, a fascinating underground network filled with centuries of history. Following this, indulge in a traditional dessert that's sure to satisfy your sweet tooth. Then, head over to Casa de Aliaga, one of the oldest colonial homes in Lima, where you'll experience the elegance and charm of the Peruvian colonial era. Wrap up your day on a perfect note with a tasting of Peru's iconic Chilcano or Pisco Sour cocktail. Finally, sit back and relax as you are taken back to your hotel, concluding a delightful day of culture, history, and local flavors.

Day 8: Thursday 7<sup>th</sup> October 2027 – Arrival in Sacred Valley:

The Sacred Valley of the Incas is a region in Peru's Andean highlands which, along with the nearby town of Cusco and the ancient city of Machu Picchu, formed the heart of the Inca Empire. Stretching roughly 60 kilometres from Pisac to Ollantaytambo, it's an area of fertile farmland irrigated by the Urubamba River and Spanish colonial villages like Pisac and Ollantaytambo.

Day 9: Friday 8th October 2027 – Sacred Valley Full Day Tour: Embark on a captivating day as you collected from your hotel to explore the enchanting Sacred Valley of the Incas. This fertile river valley unfolds a tapestry of vital sites for the Incas, blending both strategic and religious significance seamlessly. Our initial destination is the charming village of Pisac, renowned for its bustling market and ancient Inca Ruins. Take leisurely moments to wander through the vibrant market stalls, alive with a myriad of colours, before ascending to explore the Pisac, Intihuatana, Q'allaqasa, and Kinchiracay ruins. As the day unfolds, relish a delightful lunch in gardens that offer panoramic views of the Valley. Continue your journey tracing the meanders of the river Urubamba, guiding you to Ollantaytambo. This town, crowned by a colossal Inca fortress, stands as an exquisite testament to Inca town



planning. A rare historical chapter unfolds here—a momentous Inca victory over the Spanish invaders.

Day 10: Saturday 9th October 2027 – 360 Machu Picchu Train: Ollanta – Machu Picchu:

Early this morning you will be collected from your hotel and transferred to Ollantaytambo train station. Your main luggage will be collected from your hotel in the Sacred Valley and transferred to your hotel in Cusco, ready and waiting for your arrival after your visit to Machu Picchu. Today will be one of your highlights in South America with a visit to Machu Picchu. You will travel by train from Ollantaytambo in the Sacred Valley to Aguas Calientes onboard the

scenic 360 Machu Picchu Train. Arriving in one of the world's most famous ruins after the morning fog and crowds have cleared. On arrival at the train station in Aguas Calientes a representative from the hotel will be waiting to meet you. They will assist in taking your belongings to the hotel before you journey by bus up to Machu Picchu for your guided tour. Entrance times to Machu Picchu must now be pre-selected and you can select a route from 4 available circuits on the day. Your first visit must be with a guide, and you must stay within your chosen circuit. Each entrance ticket will grant up to 3 hours at the citadel. If you would like to spend more time exploring the ruins, we recommend you book an additional entrance ticket.

Day 11: Sunday 10<sup>th</sup> October 2027 – Voyager Machu Picchu train: Mapi to Ollantaytambo:

Travel from Machu Picchu to Ollantaytambo in this comfortable train and let your feet have a rest. Enjoy an authentic Andean experience, while relaxing in modern and comfortable interior design illuminated by Latin American music. Comfortable seats with tables in front to share the journey with friends.

Today, we will pick you up from Ollantaytambo train station for your Maras and Moray tour. The first stop will be Maras Salt ponds, believed to pre-date the Inca period. These shallow pools were dug into the mountainside, filled with salt water from an underground spring of an adjacent mountain. After water evaporation, the salt is carefully collected and packaged for sale. Witness locals harvesting salt in the traditional way practiced for well over 500 years. Approximately 7 km southwest of Maras, continue to Moray, which boasts an impressive Inca ruin of giant circular terraces believed to have been used for agricultural experimentation due to their exceptional irrigation system. Upon

concluding the tour, you will be transported back to Cusco. Depending on the weather and available time, you may have the opportunity to visit Chinchero, a significant Inca town featuring a colonial church and a picturesque plaza along the way. Cusco, set at an altitude of 3,400 metres in the Peruvian Andes, was once the capital of the Inca Empire. It is known for its Spanish colonial architecture and Incan remains. Narrow, cobble-stoned streets lined by Inca walls stretch out from the main plaza in every direction. Many of the colonial buildings were built on top of Incan foundations and the stonework is unparalleled in its precision and beauty.

Day 12: Monday 11<sup>th</sup> October 2027 – Cusco Walking tour with Sacsayhuaman:

Today, explore the city's fascinating history, from the Inca times colonial rule to the present day. Wind through narrow cobblestoned streets and visit the market of Cusco. Along the way, get the chance to see the colonial buildings. Visit the fascinating Koricancha Temple of the Sun and the Cathedral, built on the ruins of an Inca Palace. From here, head to Sacsayhuaman, a former Inca fortress perched atop the hill above Cusco, it

presents a work of impeccable engineering (gigantic carved rocks that t with absolute precision).

Day 13: Tuesday 12<sup>th</sup> October 2027 – Touristic Bus: Cusco-Puno:

This spectacular journey from Cusco to Puno takes you across the Altiplano. This drive will take you through sleepy

Andean villages, past spectacular snow-capped mountains, sheer cliffs and rampaging rivers. Stops along the way include the atmospheric towns of Pucara and Andahuaylillas, and the pre-Inca ruin of Raqchi. Lunch is included and you will arrive in Puno in the early evening. The journey will take approximately 10 hours. Puno lies on the shores of Lake Titicaca, the highest navigable lake in the world. It is the largest city in the Southern Altiplano and an important agricultural and livestock (Ilamas and alpaca) region. It sits at an altitude of over 3,800 metres and is a picturesque hillside city and a melting pot of the Aymara and Quechua culture.

#### Day 14: Wednesday 13th October 2027: Titicaca Uncover by Speed boat:

Early this morning you will be collected from your hotel and transferred to the port to board a fully equipped speed boat with on board service to visit various islands on Lake Titicaca. First stop is Taquile Island where you will explore a scenic and less touristy area. Enjoy time on a pristine sandy beach to relax and feel the serenity of Lake Titicaca. We then hike along a pre-Inca trail with spectacular landscapes of the island, visiting families of weavers to learn about their textile art and symbolism. In 2005, "Taquile and its Textile Art" were proclaimed "Masterpieces of the Oral and Intangible Heritage of Humanity" by UNESCO. After three hours on Taquile, board the speedboat for a short journey to the community of Santa Maria-Llachon, on the tip of the Capachica Peninsula. This is a picturesque off the beaten track destination. We are welcomed by the small Quechua speaking community and introduced to an intensive cultural experience, observing the traditions of the community and participating in an ancient ceremony to learn about their magical world. Experience the preparation of "Pachamanca", a traditional way of cooking meat, fish and potatoes using underground ovens, and one of the main dishes of Peruvian cuisine. Enjoy these delicacies in a small, but scenic restaurant (included in tour price). For the more adventurous there is an optional kayak along the coast of Llachon. After lunch we leave Santa Maria and arrive at a remote area of the National Reserve of Lake Titicaca to explore Uros Ccapi. These are considered to be the last authentic floating islands, less commercial and little visited. The Uros are descendants of one of the oldest cultures in South America. There are optional tours in reed boats before we depart back to Puno. On arrival at the port, you will be transferred to your hotel. Please note there is a minimum number of passengers requested to operate this tour from December to March, if the required number of

passengers is not reached, we will offer you a similar alternative. Please also note that between the months of January and March the ceremony of "Pachamama" will be subject to weather conditions.

Day 15: Thursday 14<sup>th</sup> October 2027 – Arrival in Quito:

Sitting at 2,850 metres above sea level high in the Andean foothills lies Quito, the capital of

Ecuador. The city, a short distance from the Equator and with an amazing backdrop of snow-capped mountains, is known for its stunning colonial architecture and artwork. Founded in the 16th century on the ruins of an Inca city, Quito has one of the largest, least altered and best-preserved historic centres in the Americas. It was declared a UNESCO World Cultural Heritage Site in 1978.

Day 16: Friday 15th October 2027 - Quito Six Senses Full Day Tour:

Today, you will embark on an immersive tour meticulously crafted to engage all of your senses. This experience promises to awaken your touch, tantalize your taste buds with culinary delights, Il your nostrils with the rich aroma of coffee beans, treat your eyes to the sight of beautiful cobblestone-lined streets and historical edifices, and serenade your ears with the melodic tolling of church bells. Moreover, we've included the sixth sense of love; you'll feel the passion that local artisans pour into their crafts and even have the chance to participate in a demonstration. Embark on your journey with an immersive exploration of Quito's vibrant streets and squares, steeped in colonial charm. Wander through the renowned Street of the Seven Crosses, admire the grandeur of Independence Square and Government Palace, and marvel at the ornate domes adorning historic churches. A leisurely stroll along bustling La Ronda Street, alive with character and bustling activity, awaits. Depending on availability, your day may include visits to artisans, indulging in traditional sweets with a delightful taste test, or joining a painting session with the esteemed Escuela Quiteña, known for their restoration work on colonial art in the city's historic chapels. You may also try your hand at making traditional ice cream or quesadillas or even weaving the iconic toquilla straw hat. Additionally, we can arrange visits to local markets where you can savor authentic cuisine, ensuring a tailored experience that reflects your preferences. As the day comes to an end, retreat to the enchanting neighbourhood of San Marcos. This area is filled with galleries, cozy coffee shops, and delightful family-owned stores, all set against the backdrop of elegant Neo-Classical architecture adorned in soft pastels. Wrap up your tour with a relaxing drink at a rooftop bar, boasting stunning views of Panecillo hill, surrounded by the historic cityscape.

Learn about Captain Alan Hancock's mission to relocate malnourished land iguanas from Baltra Island to North Seymour, resulting in the preservation of this unique species. As we explore, marvel at the lush vegetation and witness the fascinating nesting habits of the Real Frigates of the Galapagos.



Day 18: Sunday 17<sup>th</sup> October 2027 – Alya 6 Day itinerary C – Day 2:

Kickstart your day with a visit to South Plazas, a pair of enchanting small islands formed by natural uplift. Discover the unique charm of the smaller land iguanas that nest during the warm season. As we hike along the extraordinary cliff, observe the mesmerizing sea birds that call this place home. On the southern side of the Plazas, delight in the company of approximately 1000 playful sea lions (Zalophus Wollebaeki). In the afternoon, venture to Santa Fe, a central island with captivating turguoise waters protected by natural rock barriers. Witness colonies of seals basking in the sun while maiestic hawks soar above. This island is also home to one of the two species of land iguanas found in the Galapagos. Immerse yourself in the beauty of this unique ecosystem, where crabs, nocturnal herons, marine iguanas, cucuves, and land doves gracefully coexist. Don't miss the opportunity to swim and snorkel in the bay, encountering marine tortoises, rays, sea lions, and a dazzling array of tropical fish.

Day 19: Monday 18th October 2027 – Alya 6 Day itinerary C – Day 3:

Start your day with a visit to the Interpretation Centre, a modern architectural marvel located in the main port of San Cristobal. Delve into the natural wonders of the Galapagos as you learn about the islands' volcanic formation, species evolution, human settlement history, and complex management systems. In the afternoon, arrive at Lobos Islands. Take a leisurely stroll, swim, and snorkel amidst the playful company of seals, frigates, marine iguanas, lava lizards, and the small endemic Galapagos snake.

Marvel at the fascinating sea lion population as you arrive at Gardner Bay. These charismatic creatures are a highlight of the Galapagos, capturing the attention of visitors with their curiosity and playfulness. Relax on the beach and witness these remarkable animals basking in the sun. During a snorkeling session, share the waters with sea lions, sea turtles, a diverse range of tropical fish, and marine iguanas. In the afternoon, head to Suarez Point, an awe-inspiring location renowned for its vibrant blue-footed boobies. Be captivated by their unique "greeting" ritual and witness their enchanting mating dance. Marvel at the albatrosses, majestic birds weighing up to four kilograms, as they nest on Espanola Island. Keep an eye out for other remarkable wildlife, including marine iguanas, zayapas, masked boobies, finches, Espanola cucuves, and unique seagulls. Traverse the lava rock



terrain and explore lava tubes while embracing the stunning landscapes this island has to offer. Please note that albatrosses are not visible between January and March during their non-breeding season. Encounter vibrant red mangroves in this captivating environment.

Delight in the presence of marine invertebrates, sea lions, sea iguanas, frigates, and pelicans as you explore this captivating location. Next, embark on an unforgettable panga ride around Devil's Crown, a satellite islet of Floreana Island. Marvel at the distinctive group of rocks that form a crown-like shape due to constant erosion. Experience unparalleled snorkeling opportunities in the shallow waters surrounding the crown, boasting excellent visibility and a multitude of diverse fish and captivating marine creatures. Return to the vessel for a well-deserved lunch. In the afternoon, journey to Cerro Alieri, a haven of shrubs and vegetation unique to the Galapagos Islands. Discover the critically endangered plant species that thrive in this botanical paradise.

to the airport for your departure flight from the Galapagos. Take with you cherished memories of this extraordinary adventure in the enchanted archipelago. Since you are staying at the Hilton Colon Airport Hotel, a transfer is not required as the hotel is located in close proximity to the airport. There is a complimentary shuttle service between the airport and hotel which runs every 30 minutes or less. On arrival, please make your own way to the shuttle service desk, which is located outside of international arrivals, they will assist in directions for the Hilton Colon Hotel shuttle. Hotel will be notified that you will be using the airport shuttle to arrive to the hotel. Please remember to be back in time tomorrow for your departure flight. The Plaza de Armas features the beautiful 18th-century Metropolitan Cathedral, the Royal Court Palace from the early 19th century (housing the Natural History Museum), and the Central Post Office completed in 1882. Most days, you can observe the Chess Club of Chile meeting here—a great opportunity to witness locals engrossed in a game of chess. Next, venture to Cerro Santa Lucia, the hill where Santiago was founded in 1541.



Now transformed into a park with fountains, stairs leading to a fort, and a panoramic viewpoint across the city, it offers a captivating experience. Upon completing your tour, you will be transported back to your hotel. Meals: Breakfast
